Associate Principal's Column

End of Semester 1

Well, another semester has flown past, and our students will be able to enjoy a well-earned break. As usual, the first half of the year has been extremely busy, with excursions, sports events, NAPLAN testing for years 3 and 5, visiting performers and myriad other activities on top of the day-to-day curriculum. Once again, the vast majority of our students are to be congratulated for their excellent behaviour and efforts so far this year. Over the semester, we have received many compliments about student behaviour from visitors to our school and from places that our students have visited. It is obvious that the overwhelming majority of students are receiving a very positive message from home about doing their best at school and respecting the rights of others. Thank you parents and carers.

Reminder About Supervision Before and After School

Parents and carers are reminded that supervision of students before school does not start before 8.15am. If students are dropped off at school before 8.15am then no supervision is provided by staff, so students should not arrive at school before this time. After school, there is no formal supervision provided, apart from teachers on duty at the bus stop who supervise students while they wait for their buses, and teachers on duty at the bike racks who stay until all children with bikes have left. Apart from those students waiting for buses or those in after school care, all students should leave the school grounds as soon as possible at the end of the school day, unless they are staying to take part in an authorised activity such as sports training, Tae Kwon Do, Physical Culture etc. Students are not permitted to stay and play in the school grounds, regardless of

whether their parents are with them, unless there is a genuine reason for them to remain in the school grounds.

It is concerning to see some parents dropping children off at school as early as 7.30am, or sometimes even earlier, under the assumption that someone at school will take responsibility for looking after their children. Similarly, some parents leave their children waiting for up to 30 minutes, and sometimes longer, at the end of the school day before picking them up. Please be aware that school staff are not required to provide child-minding services before and after school – that is what the various out of school hours care services in the local area, including the 'Helping Hands' service operating in the school grounds, are for. The care and supervision arrangements for children outside of school hours are, and have always been, a parental responsibility. In the interests of student safety, we ask for your cooperation in these matters.

Can you believe it's the last week of term already?



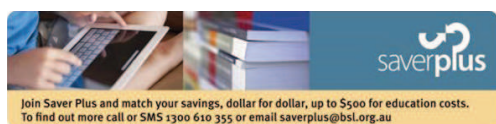
I'll be starting Drumbeat sessions with grade 5 next term and a few extra lunch-clubs.
