Associate Principal's Column

The Effective Use of Praise

The following is some interesting information I came across in a journal article, written by a child psychologist, about managing children's behaviour.

Parental attention is a powerful resource that we, as parents, often unwittingly misuse. By misbehaving, children receive negative attention such as yelling or scolding, but for many children negative attention is better than no attention. In this way, the negative attention is reinforcing the poor behaviour. Also, some children's behaviour can become so negative that parents 'give in' to the child in an attempt to avoid more unpleasantness, and this further increases the chances of the behaviour occurring again.

Parents can drastically turn around this situation by making a concerted effort to praise their child's positive behaviour. Behaviour that is praised is more likely to be repeated in the future, so parents should praise their children for everyday behaviours rather than reserving praise for 'big accomplishments.' Many parents feel that children are just expected to behave well and so should not need praise for everyday tasks. But children have a need to feel appreciated just as adults do, so parents should 'catch their children being good' by looking for positive behaviours.

Some examples of behaviours that should be praised are: listening to parents, following instructions, getting dressed on time, sharing, doing chores, playing quietly and talking politely.

Studies have shown that an additional benefit of praising children is the modelling of polite language. Children who are

praised frequently are more likely to praise others, including their peers, which in turn improves their social relationships.

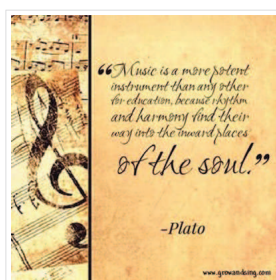
